There is no doubt that the system requires a major overhaul right from bottom to top. But the question is — how deep is the bottom? Even if we consider enrollment of students in undergraduate programmes as the bottom point, we find that standard of major chunk of students seeking admission is much below the expected minimum level. Obviously, the root of this crisis penetrates deep into the school level as well. If we can get this one thing right, i.e., find the missing links and bridge the gap of quality and standard between school and higher education levels, we can make tremendous impact on the overall higher education system. The policy, inter alia, aims to eliminate problems of quality, pedagogy, structural inequities, access asymmetries and rampant commercialization and varied other dimensions. This is high time that we break the silos and intervene every nook and corner of the higher education system to eliminate the systemic deficiencies to make best use of the opportunity presebted in the form of NEP - 2020.

The great challenge with us now therefore, is the strategic implementation of the Policy. In this context, we need to prepare a robust action plan leading to ease of implementation. To gather innovative strategies for implementation of various recommendations of the Policy on Higher Education, Association of Indian Universities adopted multipronged approach. Bringing out this title on 'National Education Policy – 2020 Transforming Higher Education in India' is one among them which is aimed at

gathering views and suggestions of experts and erudite scholars on implementation of the policy and to provide a well-structured input to the Government; and insights to practitioners of higher education on implementation strategies of NEP – 2020. This will also be a good reading for the future generations in their course of actions pertaining to higher education.
