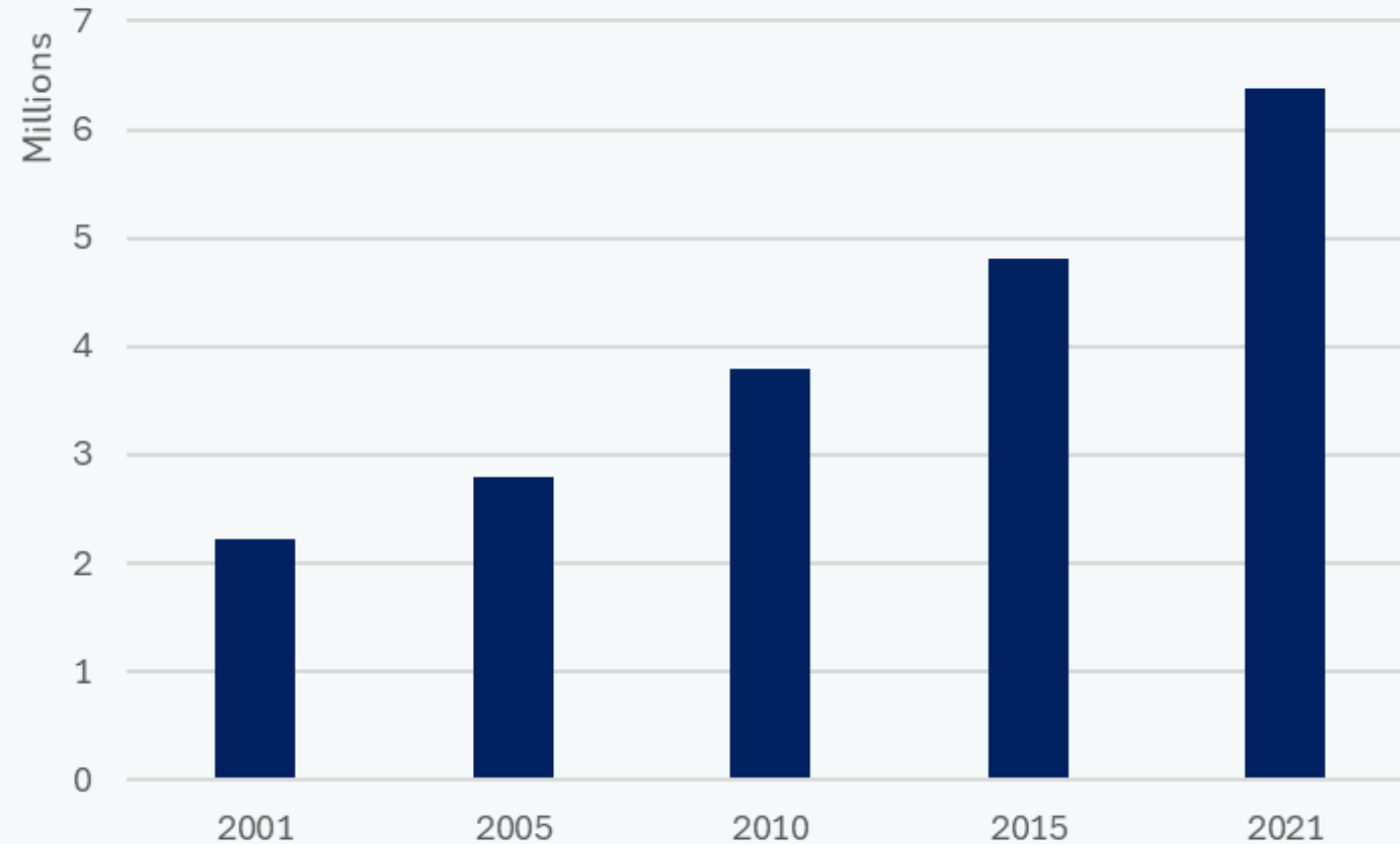

Growth of international students mobility



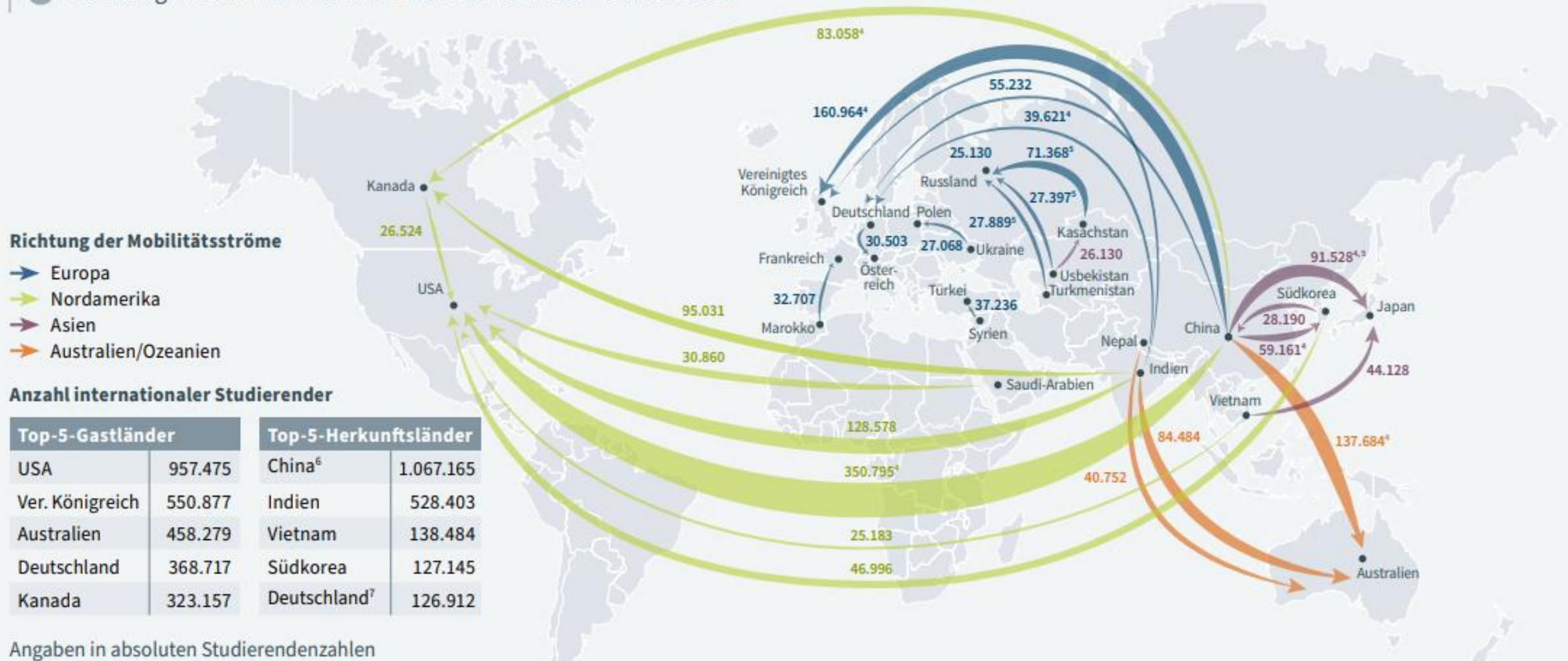
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Mobility streams – International students 2020

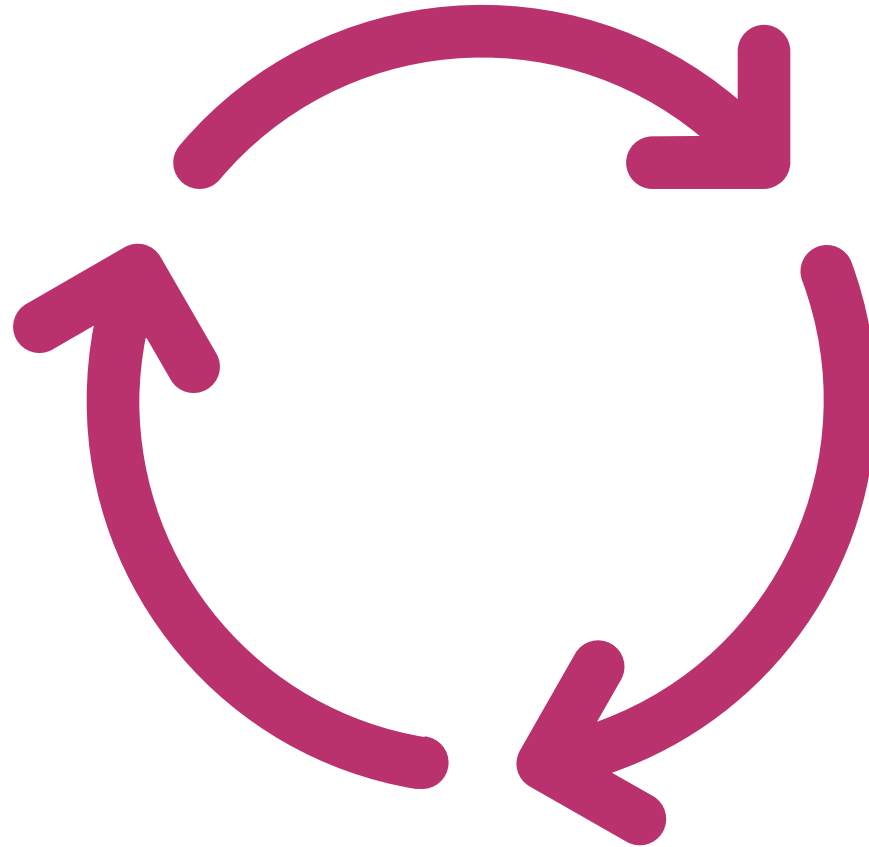

Strategy of the Federal Government

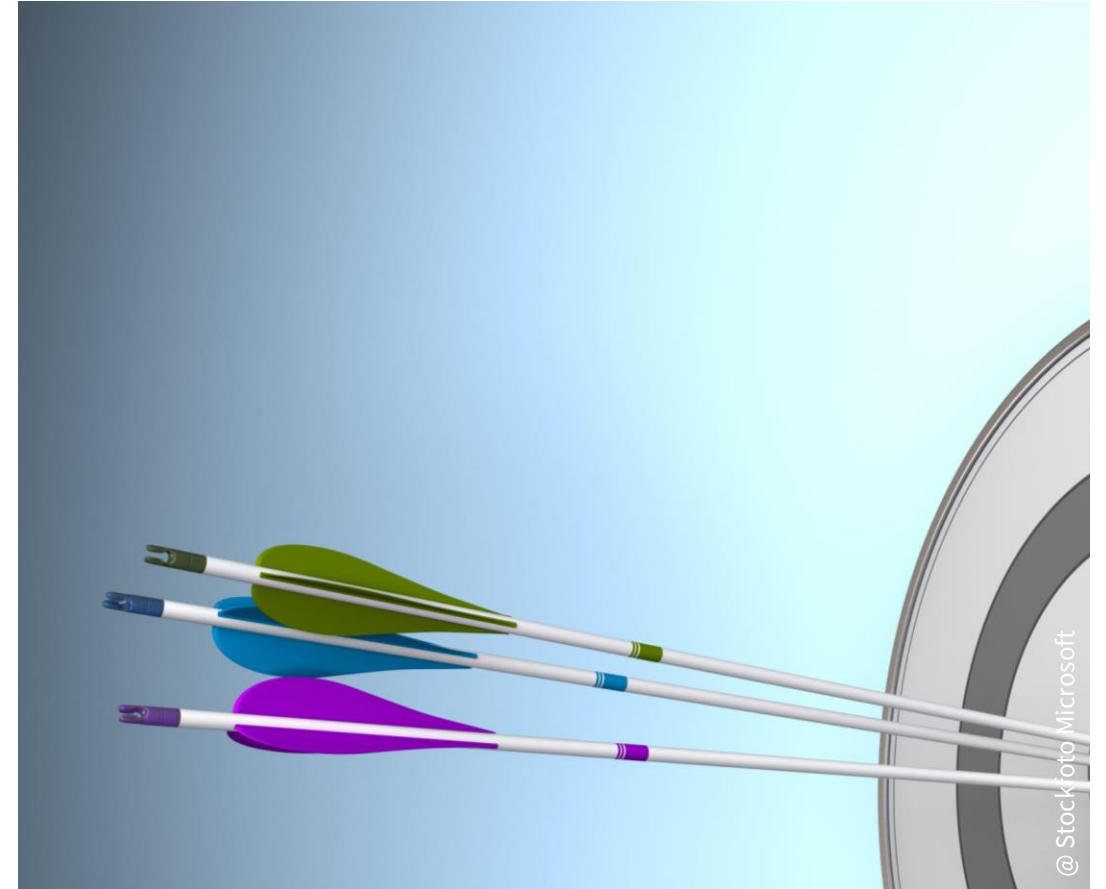


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- Internationalisation strategy of the federal government



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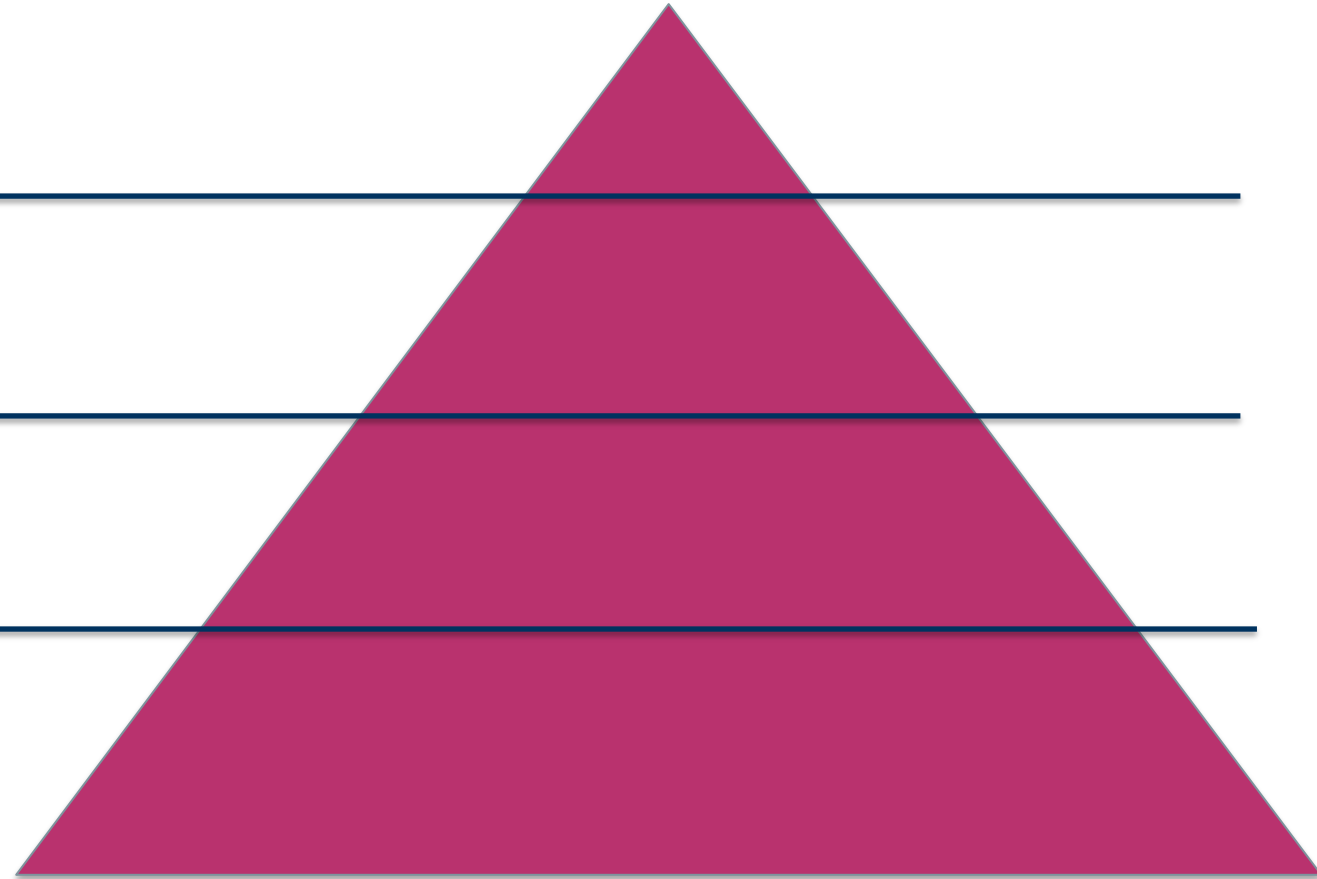

Funding – Different programmes for different purposes

- Inbound funding programs for students and faculty (to Germany)
 - Working Internship in Science and Engineering for students
 - Masterprogramms in specific domains e.g. Development studies
 - PhD Programms
 - Research stays for academicians and scientists
- Outbound funding programs for students and faculty (to the world)
 - Research Internships in Science in Science and Engineering (RISE)
 - Stay during masterprogramms
 - Research stays during PhD
 - Short-term lectureship programme



Structured exchange programmes

Higher education cooperation projects (structured programmes)

- SDG-Partnership programm
- Double degree partnerships
- International virtual academic cooperation

Bilateral exchange programmes with international funding agencies

- Bilateral scientist exchange (CSIR, IITs)
- Mobility in research projects two years (post-docs and academic staff) (UGC, DST)





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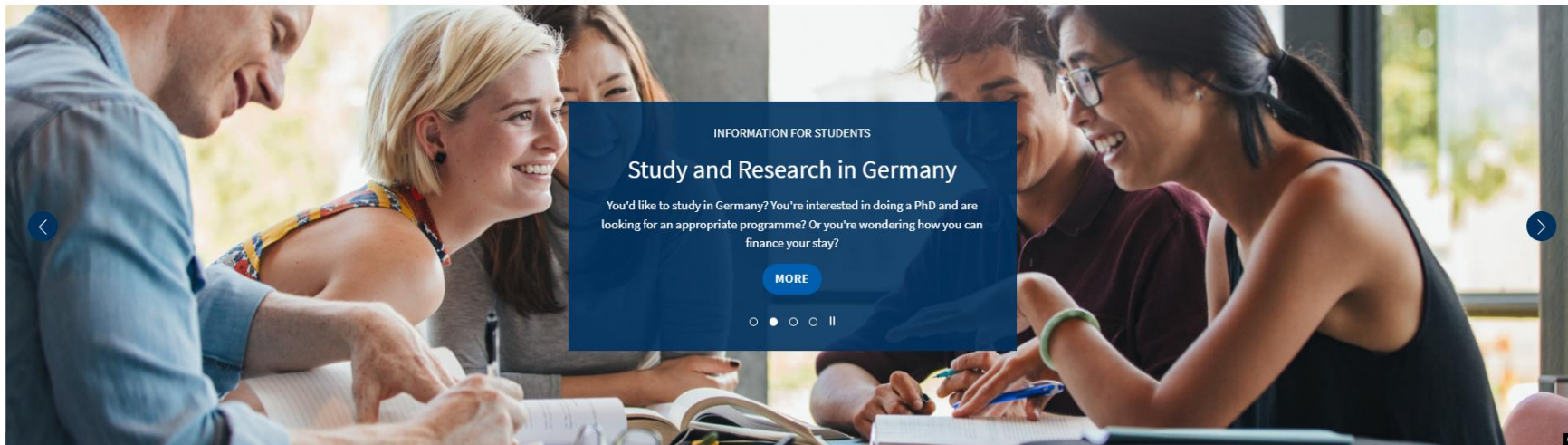

Structures and strategies on an institutional level in India need to be developed.



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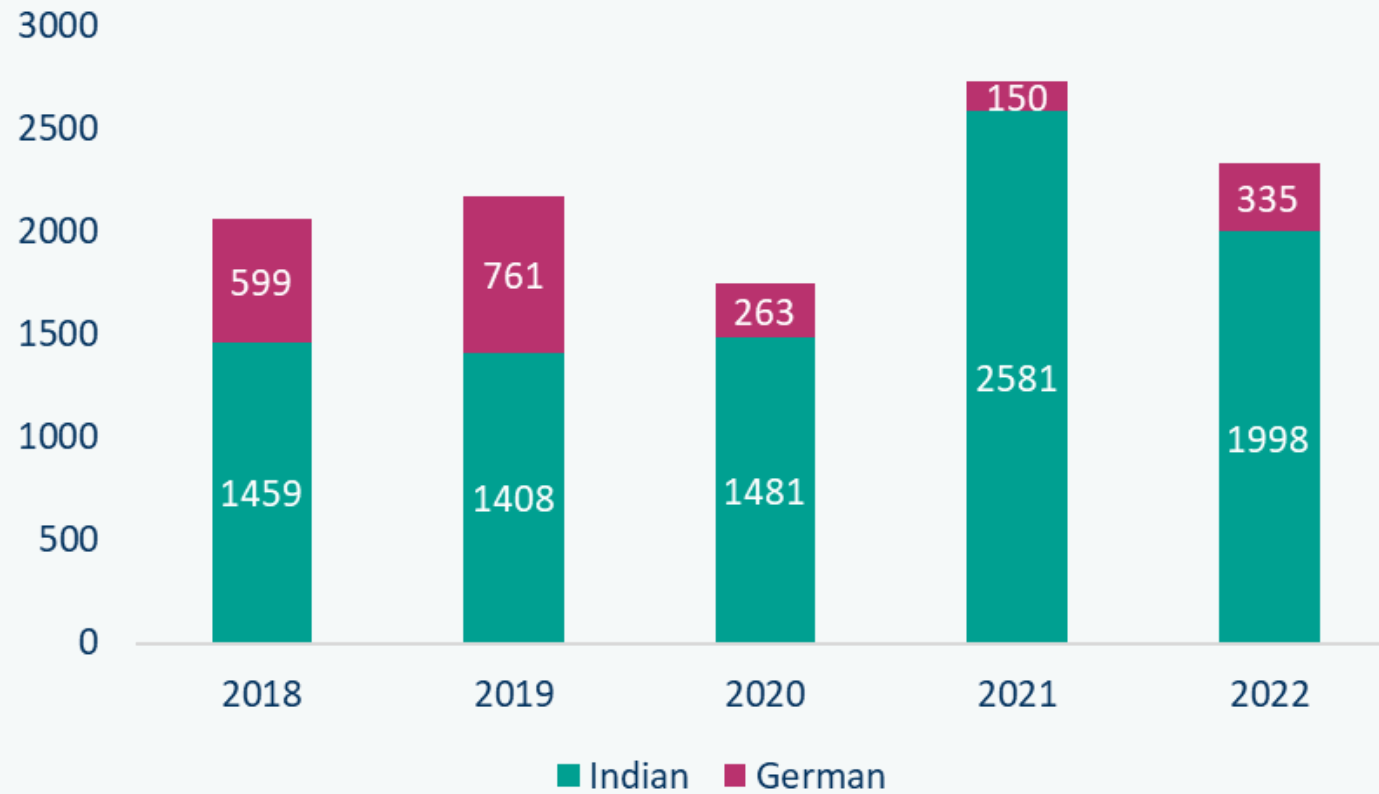

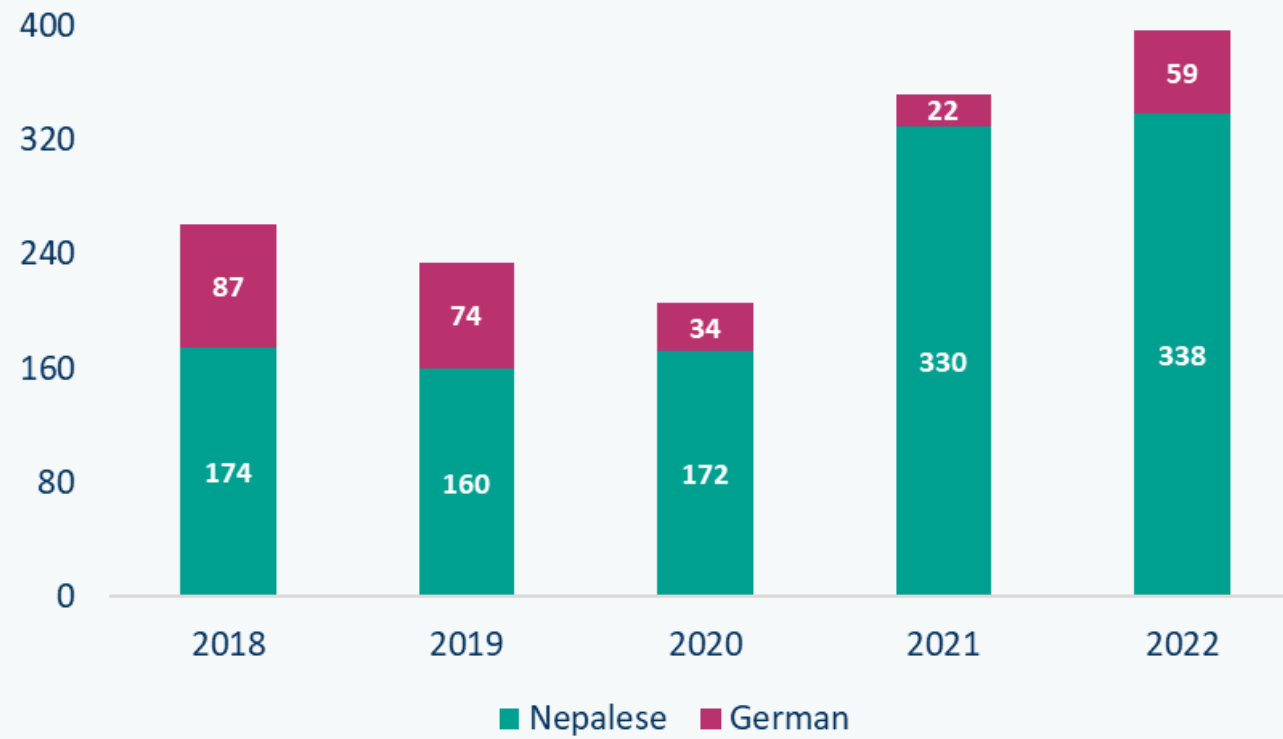
